The sampling strategy is described; although more explanation could have been provided about the sample frame to which this was applied. Ethics lists the appropriate standards; the report would be even stronger if it was explained how these were applied in this particular case.

Executive Feedback on Carameter 4 The findings systematically respond to the evaluation questions. The most robust set of findings relate to effectiveness; however, the findings on relevance, efficiency, and sustainability are much more limited in the level of evidence that is marshalled. In a few cases findings stray into very broad statements that talk about 'evidence' without naming what it is.

The MTE measured the level of their participation and involvement in the project design, planning, and monitoring activities. However, there was some limited inclusion of some groups. The designed of the Mid-Term Evaluation focused specifically on assessing the degree to which power relations among the different project stakeholders and implementers supported or undermined project results. Findings analyse gender more edtensively than conclusions and recommendations do - which are primarily concerned with institutional aspects. However, conclusions do examine the differentiated effects of the intervention
