Any gaps and limitations in the data as well as any unexpected findings should also be included and discussed. Lessons Learned should be clearly identified in the report and the process followed in developing the recommendations as well as any consultation with stakeholders should be described in the report. Finally, the annexes should include far more important elements in order to increase the credibility of the report.

Executive Feedback on Parameter 3 The methodology is clearly described and the rationale is discussed. However, there is no discussion around the extent to which the evaluation design included ethical safeguards as well as the mechanisms or measures implemented to ensure that the evaluation processes observed ethical standards. Also, the evaluation does not provide sufficient explicit information to establish whether or not the methods employed are appropriate for analyzing gender and human rights issues identified in the evaluation scope.

Executive Feedback on Parameter 4	The findings are relevant, clearly presented and based on evidence. Also, sound analysis of what the evidence reveals in the context of the evaluation is provided. However, since no evaluation criteria or questions are presented in the report, the findings are not presented in accordance to these. Finally, gaps and limitations in the data, as well as unexpected findings, are not discussed in the report.			
PARAMETER 5: CO	NCLUSIONS AND LESSONS LEARNED	PARAMETER 5	Good	
Executive Feedback on Parameter 5	The conclusions are clearly presented. They are based on findings and add value and insight to the evidence presented in the Findings section. However, the conclusions cannot reflect evaluative judgements relating to evaluation questions since the latter are not included in the report. Lessons Learned are not identified.			
PARAMETER 6: RECOMMENDATIONS		PARAMETER 6	Satisfactory	
Executive Feedback on PARAMETER 6	The recommendations are relevant to the object and purpose of the evaluation. However, the process followed in developing the recommendations, including consultation with stakeholders, is not described. Also, the recommendations are not clearly prioritised or consistently identify the target group for action.			
PARAMETER 7: GENDER AND HUMAN RIGHTS		PARAMETER 7	Meets Requirements	
Executive Feedback on PARAMETER 7	Specific statements on the evaluation criteria and evaluation questions are missing from this evaluation report, which makes it more difficult to understand how gender has been mainstreamed. However, the analysis in the findings and conclusions reveals a satisfactory level of integration.			
PARAMETER 8: THE REPORT STRUCTURE		PARAMETER 8	Satisfactory	
Executive Feedback on PARAMETER 8	The timeframe of the evaluation object, timeframe of the evaluation, locations, and a list of acronyms are missing from the report and should be included. Also, most of the customary elements, i.e. ToR, list of documents consulted, details on the methodology, the evaluation matrix, or the results matrix are missing from the Annexes.
